Keynote Speaker

Dr. Ronald Numbers, received his B.A. in history from Southern Adventist University, his M.A. in history from Florida State University, and his Ph.D. in the history of science from the University of California-Berkeley.

Dr. Numbers has previously taught at Andrews University and Loma Linda University and is currently Hilldale Professor of the History of Science and Medicine in the Department of Medical History and Bioethics at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He was awarded the 2008 George Sarton Medal by the History of Science Society for "a lifetime of exceptional scholarly achievement by a distinguished scholar." Currently he is working on a major biography of John Harvey Kellogg and will be discussing Kellogg's place in the history of medicine as well as his relationship with the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

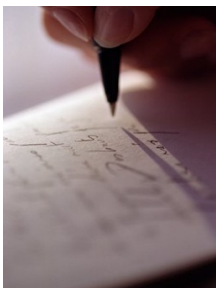
